

Khalifa Ali bin Abu Talib - Ayesha's March to Basra

Ayesha at Hau'ab

In the way some desert tribes joined the forces of the confederates. When the cavalcade reached the watering place of Hau'ab, the dogs of the village came out, and barked at Ayesha.
